Message from Pastor James\

In last months newsletter article, and in the sermon, "09/20 - What Makes a Church Grow (The Change Series)" I challenged you to read through the book of Acts to watch how relationships were used to share the Gospel. How did it go? What did you see? Relationships are built, through which the Gospel is shared.

No one gets there on their own! That's the answer when you're talking about growing churches or walking through Heaven's gates. No one gets there on their own! People come to know Jesus through people who know Jesus. In the culture to which we are called to serve today people are going to come to Church one at a time. The days of the "great revivals" filling stadiums is gone. The "great crusades" of America pouring people into church by the droves is gone. If Billy Graham were preaching today no one would be listening. That may be sad. It may be distressing, but it is still true. The Church, however, is not dead.

No one gets there on their own! You are the one that will walk side by side with them along that narrow road Jesus has laid down for us. It is a road laid out with two parts, Law and Gospel. Both are required to "follow the map."

Using the three function of the Law the way is shown to us. Through the 1) Curb, 2) Mirror, and 3) Guide we are shown the road to walk. Then realizing the road is a challenging one to follow, one no one alone can walk, we come to the Gospel which shows us Jesus walks with us the entire way, leading the way. He does that through you as you bring that simple message of salvation through Jesus to others.

As we begin to chart a path of new hope for the Church we must not, cannot, lose sight of the course Jesus has set. That course is laid out in Word and Sacrament. Deviating from those, in how they are used, or how they are taught to be used, deviates from the narrow way. Our faithfulness to our doctrine is not in the way, it is the way. Jesus words are clear, "The gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few." [Matthew 7:14] By God's good grace not too few.

If it is all so easy why does Jesus say it is hard, and why is the Church in America dying? In part because, "we've never done it that way before." Well that's not entirely true, but we have not done it that way in such a long time we've forgotten the way. The problem is we have come to a place where we feel those things the we treasure are slipping away. The way we remember things always being done give a sense of peace. When the world is a mess it's nice to come to a place where the mess should stay outside. That is what Church should be, but the Church must also prepare us to walk out into that dark mess and shine the light of Christ.

It reminds me of that proclamation of Jesus after Peter's confession, "You are the Christ..." Jesus replies, "... on this rock I will build My Church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." [Matthew 16:15-18] When you consider that verse have you ever considered the fact that gates do not attack. They don't move. They simply open and shut. What did He mean "prevail?" He meant we the Church are on the move. We the Church are to take the field. We the Church are to attack the very gates of hell. The gates of hell will not prevail against us.

We cannot hunker down hoping the devil won't notice us, and leave us alone. He is a roaring lion, a hungry lion, looking for someone to devour. [1 Peter 5:8] He will come. He will come with hate, lies, and heartless cruelty. He will come in the guise of friends. He will come in the guise of fellow Christians who are only wolves in sheep's clothing.

Such people are false apostles, deceitful workmen, disguising themselves as apostles of Christ. And no wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light. So it is no surprise if his servants, also, disguise themselves as servants of righteousness. Their end will correspond to their deeds. [2 Corinthians 11:13-15]

Satan will attack you, blind side you, and hit you where you are weak. He is relentless and evil. Jesus said, "He was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him." [John 8:44] He won't leave you alone.

We, the Holy Christian Church, are to be on the offensive, knowing we do not trek out into the world alone. The Great and Mighty Lion of Judah, Jesus the Holy Christ of God, goes before us. The gates of hell will fail and fall. Christ's Church will, in the ends, stand victorious. That is precisely what Luther wrote in the hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is Our God."

Those are all great "fighting words" but what do we actually have to do? Let's start by admitting we don't know. Then let's muster the courage to be willing to try, and to trust the Holy Spirit to guide and empower us. Let's name the field of battle. For us it is the United States of America. More specifically for us it is Austin, MN. That is the field. A vast unreached mission field in desperate need of missionaries.

If you are a Baptized believer in Jesus Christ, relying on Him for forgiveness and salvation, then you are a missionary. You are worthy to sing, "Onward Christian Soldiers" and know you are counted among them.

God's Holy word declares:

We do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm.

Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication.

To that end, keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints,
{Ephesians 6:12-18}

Then ready for battle "do justice, love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God." [Micah 6:8]

We need to learn to live comfortably among the people living in darkness. We should listen to their life stories and longings. We should bless them and be a blessing to them. Through all of this bring Jesus to them. Not with violence. Not with force. Not with an overbearing Law or a watered down Gospel, but with the full truth of God's Word. Just like Jesus did. Read the four Gospels and watch how He worked.

Once you realize that you are, and have been, armed for battle with all that you need, only one thing remains. Walk out onto the field and let God fight before you. Things change when ordinary people, the Baptized people of God, change from consumers to confessors. Things change when those accustomed to being served by professional clergy began to rise up as partners with them, assuming their rightful place as the representatives of Jesus, the Light of the world, in this dark

world. Things change when the faithful take responsibility for their place and are willing to see a different future for the Church in the United States and here in Austin.

In our Church we have identified what was needed. Now connected to the sources of hope, Jesus, we need to move. As we move we walk with Jesus in His Church, whom He will defend. We do not abandon the truth of God’s Word and the blessings that comes through His Sacraments. We delve into them, learn them, and remain faithful to them as we teach them to others. We relinquish control to God. We do that through:

- holding confidence in the Holy Spirit to do the heavy lifting.
- being willing to accept risk and adventure as we walking where we’ve not gone in a long time.
- remaining anchored in God’s Holy Word.

Already a decade ago, at every level, people asked, “Where are the leaders who help us grow? It is time to recognize they are you. We have simply forgotten how to disciple people like Jesus disciplined people, like the Apostle Paul disciplined people. Relational discipleship is the hinge on which the door to a vibrant growing future is hung.

These articles over the last few months have painted a bleak picture, made more desolate and desperate by COVID. We can get all caught up in Satan’s apparent success. Stop. Take a breath. There is still good news, the Church is not dead. It is alive. We just need to stop napping. You won’t get there by yourself. You will be regularly tempted to surrender. Don’t! Stand firm.

To make that journey, and fight the good fight, we’re going to go through some Bible studies. I’ve decided to delay “Joining Jesus” until after we have gone through about six weeks of “Becoming a Contagious Christian.” In this study we will lose the “terrifying” knock-on-the-stranger’s-door style evangelicalism, and learn how to share the Gospel comfortably and easily. Then we’ll take up “Joining Jesus on His mission.” Following that I’d like to go through “Flickering Lamps” to learn how churches can a do grow. All of this is preparation for heading into “Re:Vitality” a successful service, through our synod, that will take us to the next step.

Be of good courage. God goes before us.

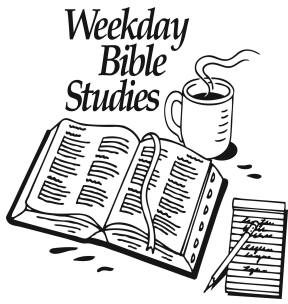

Pastor's Report to Council.

It is regrettable I must state here that no portion of the Pastor's report was included in the Council Minutes. The one in the Council Minutes was not submitted by me. It is also regrettable that hidden in the vote to approve the Council Minutes last meeting was hidden a vote to silence the pastor. Censorship is something we cannot and must not endure. Such action should, and will, require far more explanation than a passing phrase in a regular vote to approve minutes. The Council Minutes should include all reports, and all votes and actions taken by the Council.

My report to the council is as follows:

The COVID-19 situation continues and I'm sure we've all been tired of it for some time now. It currently looks like we will be at this for the foreseeable future. To accommodate a Bible study hour we have moved the second service on Sunday to 11:00am. Bible studies have started and I would encourage everyone to join at least one. During these times delving into God's Holy Word is even more necessary to feed and nourish the soul. This COVID craziness causes a lot of disruption, but we'll continue to work toward getting back to normal as much as possible.

Please do continue to wear masks while in church. I would encourage everyone to read 1 Corinthians 8. We should do nothing that would hinder someone from being fed in our church.

We continue though two sermon series. The first is called "The Change Series." Once a month we explore what St. John's can do for the Kingdom and to bring God's Word to the people around us, and how we as a church can grow by spreading the truths of the Bible and God's love for all people. We will skip the Month of November, and probably December, in this series because the Church Year Worship Calendar is a bit full. The parallel Newsletter articles will continue.

The second series is called "God's Greater Story." It will run through the end of November. It is walking through the book of Romans. This book was written by St. Paul to explain, in detail, what the Christian faith is, what it means to be a Christian, and how Christians act differently from the world around us. He gives perfect examples for us to follow today with many ways we can see how to prosper the Church even in these COVID times.

There will be information in the newsletter explaining what worship services will be through Christmas Day. Please note there on Christmas Eve we will plan four services: 3:30, 6:30, 9:00, 11:00pm. We will require people to sign up for the service they would like to attend.

Please continue to pray for the Sudanese ministry. Please pray for Pastor Reef and the souls for whom he cares. Pastor Reef and I intended to conduct a joint service but currently he is working a full-time job in addition to his duties as pastor so the service is on hold. We have our own challenges as a result of COVID. His are compounded even more so.

Lastly in reference to the troubles here at St. John's. Sadly the trouble continues. The District Office was called in to provide help and assistance last month. Their recommendation was delivered to the Council for their consideration. A recommendation I fully support and one that is in line with the recommendation by the Elders and Pastor. More information about that will be brought to the congregation later. This process has been profoundly difficult for me, the Elders, and my family. I cannot state in words sufficiently large how much we appreciate the kind words from so many. This has been a long process, which by necessity of good Christian conduct, needs to go on a bit longer. Thank you for your patience and Christian understanding as we work through this with God's Word as our guide.

- 9:30 – Candlelight Service
- 11:00 – Candlelight Service

We will require people to sign up for these services to ensure we don’t overflow the allowed number for our sanctuary under COVID protocols.

October 6, 2020

The October 6, 2020, meeting was called to order by President Dale Siegfried at 7:00 p.m.

OPENING PRAYER: Pastor Groleau

Ron Shatek resigned as vice president of St. Johns. We apologized to him for dumping this position on him at the last voters meeting.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: M/S/P to accept the secretary's report for September 8, 2020, as corrected.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Net Operating Loss: \$(40,720.32). Net Decrease in Designated Assets: \$9,943.14. Net Loss \$(50,663.46). M/S/P to accept the Treasurer's report, as written.

TRUSTEES' REPORT:

Adam Meyer will remove the dead tree and trim several other trees with low hanging branches this week. Vance fixed the lighted cross on the roof.

BOARD OF EDUCATION:

The Youth and Family/Education Boards met together on September 10th to discuss the budget for the upcoming year and decide what to do about Sunday school.

It was decided to order materials from CPH for Sunday school as this will allow us to prepare take home packets. There were 19 lessons ordered which included 7 preschool/kindergarten lessons, 6 first through third grade lessons and 6 fourth through sixth grade lessons.

On September 19th we put together Sunday school packets with the CPH materials. There were 16 packets prepared and all families were contacted regarding picking up these materials.

Our next meeting is tentatively set for Tuesday, October 20th at 5:30 p.m. We will discuss the procedure for dealing with the corona virus.

YOUTH & FAMILY BOARD:

The Youth and Family/Education Boards met together on September 10th to discuss the budget for the upcoming year and decide what to do about Sunday school.

It was also decided that the rummage sale items in the shed will be moved to Schleicher hall on Saturday, September 19th at 9 a.m. At that time we will also be putting together Sunday School take home packets.

On September 19th the contents of the shed were moved to Schleicher hall with the assistance of Kara, Ethan and Jonathon Grant. We also put together Sunday school packets with the CPH materials.

The rummage sale will be taking place on October 9th and 10th.

Our next meeting is tentatively set for Tuesday, October 20th at 5:30 p.m.

STEWARDSHIP BOARD:

Stan will resume the stewardship message for the monthly newsletter.

Reviewed the SCRIP program. Purchases are brisk. Need volunteers to sell the cards following the 9:00 a.m. Sunday church services for the winter months.

Discussed having a fall Stewardship Sunday. No decisions were made yet. Will work with Pastor James on the matter.

Offering envelopes for next year will be distributed around December 1.

We set the first Wednesday of the month at 6:00 p.m. for our regular monthly board meetings.

SOCIAL MINISTRY:

The Social Ministry board met on October 1st, 2020.

We discussed setting our monthly meeting time on the first Thursday of the month at 4:00 pm.

We will be updating the Bulletin Boards for the Shut-in Members, College Students and Military Veterans as needed.

The November Food Drive will start Sunday, November 1st and end Sunday, November 29th.

We will be putting together some information on St. John's Church and Bible material to hand out to shoppers of the Youth and Family Board's Garage Sale on October 9 and 10th.

EVANGELISM:

We began our meeting with a prayer which encouraged us to be thankful for all who bring Jesus to us through sermons, Sacrament, teaching, music and personal Christian care. We want to always be grateful for our local congregation and our brothers and sisters in Christ which God has given us.

We reviewed our goals from the past year and have agreed that we want to continue to be a welcoming presence as members begin to return to services and as we notice visitors in church.

Our community outreach may look different as there will be no coat drive or Hallelujah Harvest Festival this fall.

We will continue to monitor the church website so that visitors will have updated service dates and times. We updated church brochures with the new service times and dates. We prepared new member folders and have given one to Lee and Aidan Grant.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Pastor is working on getting regular activities and services up and running.

We'll have our regular Thanksgiving and Advent services. We will offer four worship services on Christmas Eve to accommodate social distancing.

- c. Discuss a special congregation meeting on Sunday Nov 1 to approve using AoR for congregation reconciliation services. Congregation will be notified of the reason for this meeting in the bulletin, newsletter and mailing to each household.

Closed with personal prayer petitions and the Lord's Prayer.

OLD BUSINESS:

St. John's Fall Voters Meeting will be Sunday, November 22, at 12:00 noon. This will mostly cover discussing and approving the 2021 budget and presenting the goals and plans of the various boards.

NEW BUSINESS:

Dale announced that St. John's annual volunteer ditch clean-up will be Sunday, October 25, at 1:00-3:00 p.m.

We were able to discuss with Dwight Schettler, representing Ambassadors of Reconciliation (AoR), on live streaming throughout our 2-hour meeting. After much discussion, motion made and seconded to approve, endorse and recommend to the congregation engaging Ambassadors of Reconciliation to provide congregation reconciliation services using undesignated cash assets at an initial cost of \$14,000. It passed with 8 voting yes and 3 voting no. A voters meeting regarding this has been scheduled for Sunday, November 1, right after the second service (approximately 12:00 noon).

ADJOURNMENT: M/S/P to adjourn at 9:06 p.m.
