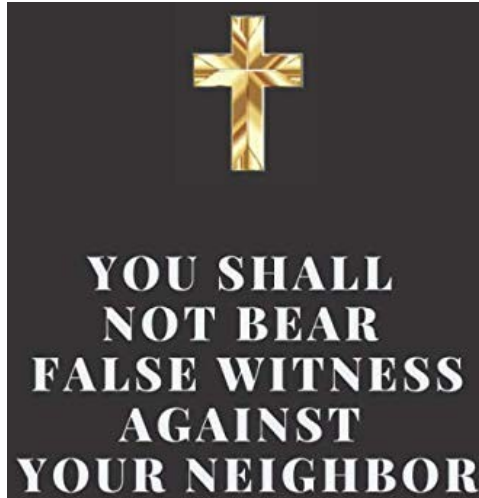


**Sermon for

As we Gather

To understand this commandment you must understand that there are three things a Christian should know in order to be saved. First we should know what to do, and what not to do, Second, we need to know where to go for help to obtain what we need to be what God demands. Third, we must know how to get to the place where that help can be found. The Church provides those things through: First, the Commandments that show us that we are sick. Second the Creeds which tell us where to go to find the cure. Third, the Lord's Prayer teaches us where to go, and how to ask, for all that we need.
