Message from Pastor James

Why is Bible study important? Why should it be the first thing we do, not the last (if we have time)? God's Word is not in the way, it is the way. If God's Word is the last thing we do (if we have time) why should we expect God to bless our work done in His name. The work of the Church is the work of God. We can not do the work of the Church without looking to God's Word to see what that work should be, and how it should be done. If you catch yourself saying, "I don't have time" or "I already know that stuff" you are in far more trouble then you recognize.

The holiday (holy days) season is a time to remember when God came to save us, however the busyness of the time with church, family, travel, presents and more can break into our time with God. Add to that football, the Super Bowl, weather and more... with a little reflection you can look back and see God was given the backof-the-bus seat.

With the new year comes a time to reflect and reset. Resolutions are useful so let's resolve to get back to God's Word and learn more of His will for us. As we wind down our study of the Lord's Prayer and walk into March we will begin the time of Lent and our look at the Sacred Supper we receive from God to heal, strengthen and save us.

I would encourage everyone to make that new year's resolution to join us for Bible study each Sunday morning at 10am.

> How precious to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them! *Psalm 139:17*

Seven is a good Biblical number and 777 is often used to represent God. What follows is 21 (3x7) reasons to study God's Word using God's Word as our guide.

1. Receiving Direction

Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. Psalm 119:105

It's important to study the Bible because God's Word guides you in the right direction through life. It lights the way so you can see clearly through the storms of life. Through every season you can be confident God is always leading you through His Word.

2. Answered Prayer

If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. John 15:7

When God's Words abide in you, you will be able to pray according to His will and have confidence He hears you. [1 John 5:14] This isn't simply wishful thinking. Studying the Bible gives you God's heart and mind for your life, and for people around you. God joy is in answering when you pray from this place of abiding in His Word.

3. Strengthened in Faith

Faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ. Romans 10:17

Being exposed to God's Word energizes and feeds faith in you. You will know what to believe and on what to foundation your faith. There you will find a deeper knowing in your heart and mind which only God's Word can bring.

4. Nourishment so You Can Mature

Jesus answered, "It is written, "'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.'" Matthew 4:4

Life is much more than seeking and experiencing pleasures in the world. The Scriptures become your life-line to a relationship with the God who created you and desires your salvation. Just as your body needs food to survive, God's Word nourishes your soul so you can become spiritually mature and better able to deal with life's challenges and temptations. [1 Peter 2:2]

5. Built-Up in Resistance to Temptation

I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you . Psalm 119:11

Studying God's Word strengthens you make time when you have no time. As more Scripture is stored up in your heart, the more you'll be strengthened in the core of your being for God. Martin Luther said he spent two hours each day in Bible study and prayer unless he didn't have time. Then he spent three.

6. Instruction

All Scripture is God-breathed and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the person of God may be complete, equipped for every good work. 2 Timothy 3:16-17

The purpose of Bible Study is to bring <u>instruction</u>, <u>conviction</u>, <u>correction</u> and <u>training</u> in God's ways so you can be equipped for every good work. You can be instructed with teaching from God for wisdom, truth and everything you need for life and godliness. [2 Peter 1:3] The Bible not only gives you truths you can believe but also instruction how to live life. No matter what your background and experience might be, you can receive God's instructions directly from Him as you study the His Word.

7. Conviction

Studying the Bible gives you a strong conviction about what is true and what God's will is for your life. God's Word builds you up and strengths your faith so you can stand against the storms you encounter.

8. Correction

God's Word corrects you when you're going the wrong way. God loves you enough to correct you and discipline you, rather than tolerate you. Correction can be painful at times but God does it so you can walk in His blessing rather than go in the way that reaps the harsh consequences of your actions.

A great prayer to pray is:

Search me, O God, and know my heart! Try me and know my thoughts! See if there be any grievous way in me,

9. Training in Righteousness or Holiness

We read the Bible is because it trains you so you can fulfill God's plan for your life. Regular Bible Study trains you in God's ways. You can understand God's ways and live out His will.

10. Equipping for Every Good Work

The Bible equips you so you can fulfill every task God has for you in life, whether it's family, ministry, or career. *[Ephesians 2:10]* Studying the Bible will empower you to grow in God's wisdom, love, and strength. There will always be challenges in the world around you. God's Word equips you to make an impact.

11. Clear Mind

The Word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

Hebrew 4:12

God's Word cuts through the distractions in your thoughts and emotions so you can know God and understand yourself in God's plan better. It can be challenging to know the real motivation in the deepest part of your inner being. The Word of God isn't just ideas and thoughts in an old book. It is God-breathed. [2 Timothy 3:16-17] It is living and active and is activated in your life when you study the Scriptures.

12. Freedom

Jesus said to the Jews who had believed Mim, "If you abide in My Word, you are truly My disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." John 8:31-32

The Accuser (the devil) will attack with lies and half-truths to immobilize you. You might be tempted to fight or run away. When you abide in God's Word by reading, studying and living it, you'll be free. You'll receive the truth that frees from the leadings of this world. You will be free to follow Jesus and live out God's plan for your life.

13. Wisdom Beyond Your Years

I have more understanding than all my teachers, for your testimonies are my meditation. *Psalm 119:99*

You will receive wisdom from heaven, beyond the limitations of your training and life-experience. In reading the Bible you get to think God's thoughts with Him. You receive insight and wisdom to know God and apply His will in the world around you.

14. Revived Soul

The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul; the testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple. *Psalm 19:7* Being exposed to God's Word refreshes and revives your mind. The world brings endless pressures with greed, jealousy and anger all around. Studying God's Word brings His wisdom into situations that would otherwise bring devastation to your soul.

15. Delight

How sweet are Your Words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth! Psalm 119:103

God's Word brings delight to your heart. The Bible becomes your source of life and joy as you live in God's design. There is a reality of real delight and inner joy that cannot be taken away from you. Through every season of your life, through all the good and even the trials, you can know the sweetness of God's Word as you draw near to Him and experience His goodness.

16. Cleansing

That He might sanctify her (the Church), having cleansed her by the washing of water with the Word.

Ephesians 5:26

God uses His Word to purge you of the things that bring bitterness and hopelessness into your life. God's Word washes your mind, your will, and emotions so you can think clearly and love God with all your heart, soul, strength, and mind.

17. Others Are Impacted by Your Life and Service

Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.

Colossians 3:16

When you study the Bible, God's wisdom gets stored up in your heart and mind. It will infuse your life with God's truth and encouragement. It will spill-over into those around you as you live for God. The more you get God's Word in you, the more His love and power will flow through you to people living in brokenness and pain around you.

18. Blessing and Prosperity

Blessed is the one who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; but his delight is in the Law of the Lord, and on His Law he meditates day and night. He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers. *Psalm 1:1-3*

As you think and meditate on God's Word, your mind will be renewed. [Romans 12:2] When you draw on God's truth and wisdom for every decision and every challenge, you'll see the powerful results of God's blessing in every season of your life. You'll see fruitfulness in your labors and experience God's abundance in your life.

19. Courage so You Can Be Successful

This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it. Then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good

success. Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go. *Joshua 1:8-9*

Regular Bible Study strengthens you and gives you courage to face the world. You will grow in confidence of God's truth. You will understand more of His desires for you, understanding all God has done for you through Jesus Christ. God's Word you free from fears so you can be successful in His assignments for you in life. No matter what is holding you back, you can move forward with confidence as you follow God's Word.

20. Equipped to Stand in the Face of Spiritual Warfare

Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God. Ephesians 6:17

The Word of God becomes your weapon as you stand to face of life's challenges and struggles. God has provided everything you need for your life as you pursue Him. As you stay connected to Him through His Word, you will be able to stand and persevere until the day that you stand before Him. All Scripture becomes available to you to overcome any discouragement, doubts or fear that might come against you. God has made you more than a conqueror. [Romans 8:31-39]


21. Endurance and Encouragement

The book, *Light in the Dark Belt*, is the autobiography of Rosa Young. You have to remember this is written about the early days of the 1900's and on. and the verbiage then was different compared to today. To me she is the Martin Luther of Alabama--always advocating for her fellow man to follow "the Light", teach the children, and lead by example. She tells about life in her era--read the first chapter and weep. This chapter tells about the physical living conditions on the plantation for the colored people. Rosa tells about the lack of spiritual knowledge among her people.



The back cover reads: This little volume is to tell its readers in plain, simple words how the Almighty God, for Christ's sake, in a mysterious way, prepared

and led me and a host of others out of the gross darkness which hung like a dense fog over our souls into the marvelous light of His salvation.--Rosa Young

Here is the inspiring story of Rosa Young, who labored tirelessly to establish Christian schools throughout the Deep South.

Rosa's passion for education med her to influence the founding of 30 Lutheran schools, 35 Lutheran congregations, and Concordia College Alabama. An advocate for children, she touched the lives of more than 2,000 students in Alabama alone. ...

This is an interesting book. I keep asking myself could I have done what she did? Only with God's help and guidance would be the answer She never gave up. Rosa came from a heritage of nothing to living with almost nothing. How she could stretch those dollars to "make do". She was always advocating for Jesus, her schools, Jesus, the children, Jesus. What an example she gave and still gives us today.--Jesus is the only way. You will find this inspiring book in our church library.
